<u>Martha Adams was awarded 4-H Adult Volunteer</u>. Martha has been involved with 4-H for over 40 years, has been a club leader, has served on advisory councils, and served on the Duval County 4-H Foundation Board.

<u>4-H Teen Leader was given to Joshua Daniels</u>. Joshua has been involved in 4-H for 11 years and is President of his club, the Duval Diplomats and a member of the Duval 4-H Exchange Club. He has been involved in the County Council for the last three years and currently serves as the Secretary. These are just a few highlights of Joshua's 4-H career to date thus far

George Corey was awarded the Friend of Extension award. George is a native and lifelong resident of

Jacksonville. He has served on numerous boards, but most notably the Central Civitan Club, where he held every office and traveled extensively representing his club. 2016 Foundation Scholarships

Each year the Duval County 4-H Foundation awards two \$1,000.00 scholarships to deserving 4-Hers. One of the scholarships is named the Tom Braddock Scholarship, and the other is called the James Watson Scholarship.

Tom Braddock was a Cooperative Extension Director, as well as a Founder of the Duval County 4-H Foundation.

James Watson was the Cooperative Extension Director prior to Tom Braddock. He had a weekly radio show titled "*Good Morning Neighbor*" and was also a founding member of the 4-H Foundation.

The **James Watson Scholarship** goes to Courtney Toelle. Courtney is an Art History Major at the University of Central Florida. She was an active 4-H member, participating in livestock and poultry judging, Fashion Revue and Share - the - Fun. Volunteering at the

Munch Wagon and sweeping during the fair, were also some of her activities. Courtney has also modeled for the state - level Fashion Revue Exhibition the past two years and placed fourth at the state Share the Fun.

The **Tom Braddock Scholarship** goes to Brooke Feltman. Brooke has been a member of the Mandarin Mounties for three years, and served as the clubs Vice President and Treasurer. Her favorite project was learning how to care for horses. She has also participated in her school parade where they decorated their own float and showed 4-H pride, cooking projects and weekly school clean - ups. Brooke's future plans are to attend the University of Florida, volunteer with Habitat for Humanity, and become an Architect.
