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Duval County 4-H Awards and Recognition Guidelines



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2014-2015

Awards and recognition are important parts of motivating individuals. Dollar amounts listed in this document may change anytime during the year depending on availability of funding. Duval 4-H members can reduce the cost of attending identified trips and events in two ways - Clover Bucks and a Foundation Scholarship.

Recognition Model

This model may help us understand the purpose of awards and recognition.

Individual 4-H Member Awards

Clover Awards

Due to a drop in donation, the Duval County Foundation has allocated \$0.00 for Clover Awards. However, should funding become available, the following method will be used to determine Clover Buck amounts.

- Duval County will use the Florida Clover Awards applications with slight county adjustments
- Clover Buck credits must be used by May 31st of the following year in which they are awarded
- Clover Bucks are credits and no cash will never be paid directly to a member, for used or unused credits
- 4-H Members must use their Clover Bucks before they can apply for a Foundation Scholarship
- The winners of each award category will receive a Clover Bucks points for each level they achieve as follows:

Age	Bronze	Silver	Gold	Emerald
CloverBuds	-	-	-	-
Juniors	1	2	3	-
Intermediates	1	2	3	5
Seniors	1	2	3	5

The total number of points earned will be divided into the amount budgeted to determine how much each point is worth. Last year, each point will be worth approximately \$16.00. However, certificates will be awarded at the awards night regardless of clover buck funding.

Transportation

All 4-H members are responsible for the arrangement and payment for transportation to and from the activity or event.

- The 4- H Van may be made available for 4-H trips following the guidelines set by the Duval 4-H Foundation. The Foundation will determine what activities and events the 4-H Van can be used for.
- Use personal transportation
- Use commercial transportation

Adult Chaperones

4-H members are responsible for recruiting Adult Chaperones. Overnight Chaperones need to complete the State Certification Training. Chaperones needed for participants will be paid for by the additional participants.

Foundation Scholarship Selection

All 4-H members that are interested in applying for Duval County 4-H Foundation Scholarships need to complete the application. The selection of scholarship winners will be made by the 4-H Foundation Selection Committee. The application includes the selection criteria. Any 4-H member can choose to attend events, but the 4-H Foundation will only pay for the number of individuals permitted by the budget. 4-H Members who are not selected will pay for all costs of the activity including registration, transportation, and securing and paying for the cost of required chaperone.

- State 4-H Activities
- District 4-H Activities
- National 4-H Activities

Clover Bucks do not carry over from year to year and cannot be applied to activities that occur after May 31st of the following year.
